## Summer Assignment 2017

### 1. United States Map

- a. Fill out provided blank U.S. map with all 50 state names and capitals
- b. Color the map in by region: Pacific (5 states), Mountain (8 states), North Central (12 states), South Central (4 states), Southeast (10 states), Mid-Atlantic (5 states), & New England (6 states)
- c. Memorize all 50 states and capitals

### 2. United States Presidents

- a. Memorize the order of all 44 U.S. Presidents and their political parties
  - i. This is easier if done in 5 president blocks
- b. You will be tested on these the first week of class

### 3. AP Reading, *American History, Brinkley, Chapter 1 & Chapter 2*

- a. You must pick up the AP United States History Handout before you leave for summer break.
- b. Read Chapter 1, pages 2-25, and Chapter 2, pages 26-57, in the *Brinkley, American History* Handout
- c. Take Cornell Notes on the chapter 1 & 2 reading
- d. Answer the following questions #1-20 from Chapter 2 (located on the back of this page) in short answers

### 4. Chapter 2 Poster “One Pager”

- a. Create a poster on one of the following sections from Chapter 2.
  - i. Jamestown and the Virginia Colony (pgs. 28-32)
  - ii. Bacon’s Rebellion (pgs. 34-35)
  - iii. Plymouth Plantation and Massachusetts Bay Colonies (pgs. 35-37)
  - iv. New England Settlers and Natives (pgs. 38-42)
  - v. The Carolinas (pgs. 42-44)
  - vi. The Quaker Colonies (pgs. 45-46)
  - vii. The Caribbean Islands (pgs. 47-48)
  - viii. The founding of Georgia (pgs. 51-52)
  - ix. The Dominion of New England and the Glorious Revolution (pgs. 55-57)
- b. Poster must have a title, visuals (photos or pictures), key terms (definitions), several key bullet points, and a paragraph summary of the section.
- c. Small to Middle sized posters only, (No huge ones)
- d. Make this as creative as possible
- e. Be prepared to present this the first week of class

- a. The Cornell Notes, Chapter Questions (#1-20), and the Chapter Poster are all due at the beginning of the first class
