

STUDENT STORES

Purposes

1. To provide a realistic instructional station for students.
2. To provide a convenient location where students may purchase school-oriented goods.
3. To enhance the morale of the student body.
4. To cooperate with the student body government and clubs in the sale of tickets and special interest items.
5. When appropriate, to provide a central distribution point for such items as yearbooks, caps and gowns, etc.

Guidelines For Operation

1. Student store operation is a function of the student body organization and the student government should establish procedures to oversee its operation.
2. It is expected that every effort will be made to avoid competition with private enterprise when private enterprise can more effectively serve the needs of the student body.
3. Student stores will not handle items in competition with the cafeteria.
4. Student stores will carry items that relate to the students' needs at school and will refrain from carrying items for non-school use.
5. It is expected that the items carried in a student store will vary from school to school as each store attempts to meet the needs of its students.
6. Products made in school shops or classes wherein costs of materials have been reimbursed by the student to the District may be sold.
7. Products made from school-supplied materials wherein costs have not been reimbursed shall not be sold. (Such materials may be authorized for sale under provisions of E.C. Section 39521 wherein value is \$500 or less. In this case, all proceeds shall accrue to the District.)
8. Products made at home and for which the District has not supplied materials may be sold.
9. Student body organizations are authorized to determine the percentage, if any, of the sales' proceeds that shall be retained by the student store as a cost of doing business.
10. Each student body organization shall, if it desires to authorize such sales, adopt policies and regulations authorizing sales.

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
