ANNUAL REPORT TO THE VOTERS for 2020/21 DECEMBER 13, 2021

Executive Summary

10 The "Committee", includes both bond measures M and B, has reviewed all available 11 data on the expenditures of the bond funds, and found that none of the funds were 12 spent on projects not included in the bond measure specifications nor for any expenses 13 not allowed under the law.

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15 Background

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17 On March 8, 2016 the Board of Trustees approved the newly formed "Committee" for 18 the Measure B and Measure M bonds. This report is issued by the Committee.

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20 Measures M a general obligation school bond measure was passed in November 2002,

21 Measure B a general obligation school bond measure was passed in November 2014,

22 and Measure W a general obligation school bond measure was passed in November

23 2020 by the voters of the Salinas Union High School District (hereinafter "District") in

accordance with Proposition 39. The funds raised by Measure B are dedicated

25 specifically to the repair, maintenance, physical improvement and expansion of the

26 District's high schools (including construction of the new high school). Funds raised by

27 Measure M are dedicated specifically to the repair, maintenance, physical improvement

and expansion of the District's middle schools, and purchase of a site for and
 construction of a new middle school. Measure W is dedicated specifically for the repair,

30 maintenance, physical improvement and expansion of all of its schools and school sites.

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32 <u>The Committee</u>

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34 Under Proposition 39, applicable implementing legislation relating thereto, and the

35 California Education Code (together hereinafter "Law"), the District was required to

36 establish a Citizens' Oversight Committee (hereinafter "Committee") for each of the

bond measures. This was done in 2002 for Measure M. That committee was

disbanded and the newly formed "Committee" encompasses all Measure funds at that

time were both Measure B and Measure M. With the passage of Measure W at the

40 November 3, 2020 general election the committee is further assigned and assumes

41 responsibility for all three measure B, M, & W (hereinafter "the Measures"). The Law and

42 the Committee's current Bylaws (available for viewing on the District's website:

43 www.salinasuhsd.org) set forth the required membership of the Committee.

80 81 82	<u>Committee Responsibilities</u>
82 83 84 85 86 87	Applicable California law states that the Committee shall actively review and report on the expenditures of school bond revenues raised under the provisions of Proposition 39. Specifically these responsibilities are listed in the Committee's Bylaws. In summary they include the following:
88 89	 Ensuring that Measure M, B and W bond funds are spent only as allowed by the Law.
90 91 92 93	 Reviewing copies of annual performance and financial audits. Inspecting projects financed by Measure M, B and W funds at school sites. Reviewing cost-saving efforts by the District to maximize the efficient use of bond funds.

- 94 Reporting annually to the voters on the results of its activities.
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Findings of the Committee

- 98 The Committee has received full cooperation and all data requested from the District for 99 the facilitation of its review of the expenditure of Measures B and M funds as required by the Law.
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101 The status of all the bond projects, as well as an accounting for fund expenditures and

102 balances, may be found in Appendix 1 for Measure B and in Appendix 2 for Measure M. 103 These appendices are attached to and made a part of this report.

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- 105 Measure B project is the construction of Rancho San Juan High School, Alisal High and Salinas High 2 Story Classroom Buildings and are shown in Appendix 1.
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107 Measure M projects include the construction of New Middle School #5, now named as

108 the Dolores C. Huerta Middle School. This project has been completed through the

109 approval process of the Division of the State Architect (DSA) and California Department

110 of Education (CDE) plan approvals and offsite road and utility improvements to the new

- 111 school site. The unsold remainder of the Measure M bonds (\$8,501,072) will eventually
- 112 be sold to help finance this construction.
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114 Measure W projects include improvements, modernizations, and new construction at

115 both Middle and High School sites. As of this writing no sale of bonds has been

completed against Measure W and the SUHSD Board of Trustees is currently assigning 116

- 117 budgets and prioritizing the lengthy project list in accordance with the bond measure.
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119 As of Decemer 1, 2021 the cash balance of Measure M bond funds is \$4,156,315 and in

- 120 Measure B funds it is \$36,282,909. These balances reflect initial bond sales, plus
- any refinancing bond sales, plus interest received on fund balances, held pending 121
- 122 payments on projects, and less the costs to date of the projects. These cash balances,
- 123 plus the revenue from the sale of the yet unsold Measure M bonds (\$8,501,072) will be
- 124 used to complete the remaining uncompleted projects (including construction of a new
- 125 middle school), the continued construction of Rancho San Juan High School Phase II
- 126 Stadium and any of the Board approved projects for Measure B, to pay any legitimate
- 127 bills outstanding on approved projects, and to expand projects where allowable under
- 128 law and within the project definitions approved in the ballot measure specifications.
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- 130 The Committee has reviewed periodic reports submitted by the District on the
- 131 expenditures of Measures B and M funds, and has found no indication that any
- 132 expenditures to date of Measures B or M funds were made in violation of the Law. No
- 133 Measures M or B funds have been spent on salaries, operating expenses or projects
- 134 not included in the Measures M and B specifications, and no administrative expenses
- 135 have been charged to Measures M or B funds except as permitted by Law.

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- 137 The Committee has reviewed the legally required performance audits for Measures M
- and Measure B by an independent third party (Eide Bailly, LLP) for the fiscal year
- ending June 30, 2019, the latest such audit reports available at this writing. In these
- performance audits a random sampling of the projects in progress during the audit
- 141 period were examined, and, within these samples, the auditors found no violations of
- 142 law in the expenditure of Measure B or Measure M funds. This audit has been
- accepted and approved by the District's Board of Trustees and by the Committee.
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- 145 The financial audit of the District's financial condition, practices and accounting by an
- independent third party (Eide Bailly, LLP) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019 were
- the last financial audit reports reviewed by the Committee. Both the financial and
- 148 performance audits statements and review of internal controls found no violations of law
- 149 in the financial statements nor internal controls of Measure M and Measure B funds and
- 150 that funds were expended only for the specific projects approved by the voters in 151 accordance with Proposition 39 and outlined in Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3)(c) of the
- accordance with Proposition 39 and outlined in Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3)(c) of theCalifornia Constition.
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- 154 The Committee continues to monitor the District's efforts to maximize efficiency and
- 155 effectiveness in the expenditure of Measures M and B funds, and is satisfied that the
- 156 District is spending those funds for achievement of the best long-term value to the
- 157 District rather than simply contracting for the cheapest products.
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- 159 <u>Conclusions</u>
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- 161 Measures M and B, "The Measures", Annual Report for 2021 ending December 1, 2021. Is submitted to the Board of Trustees by the Committee in accordance
- 162 with Education Code Section 15278(b). The Committee advises to the best of its
- 163 knowledge based on available information provided by the District, SUHSD is in full
- 164 compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California
- 165 Constitution.
